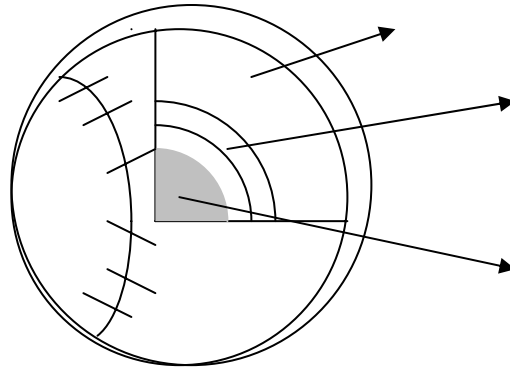
Swimming
